Georgia In the name of God amen
Troup County I John W Hendrick of the County
and State aforesaid being weak in body but of sound
mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed
for all men to die do make and ordain this
my last will and testament hereby revoking all
former wills by me made

1st It is my will and desire that the whole of
my estate be equally divided between my loving
wife Martha Hendrick and my two children
Morton J Hendrick and Mary Eliza Hendrick
and in case of the decease of my wife who is
now on a bed of sickness then I desire my estate
to be equally divided between my two children
above named.

2nd It is furthermore my will and desire that
my property be kept together for the present under
the management of my Executors and so continue
untill they in their judgment shall believe a
favorable time has arrived to obtain fair prices
for the same; then it is my will and desire that
the whole of my property both personal and
be sold to the best advantage by my Executors
and the monies arising therefrom to be kept at
interest for the support and benefit of my heirs
above named.

In order to carry out and effect this my last
will and testament, I hereby make & appoint
my two friends William A Read & Thomas
Wood my Executors. In testimony whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this first
day of September 1837
