

John Palmer deceased. Will.

Froup County Wills 1832-1848

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Georgia Group County. In the name of God Amen. I John Palmer, being of sound mind but in bad health, and knowing that all men have to die, take it into Considerations to make this my last Will and Testaments.

Item 1st. At my death I command my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried at the discretion of my friends, and all the expences to be paid out of the money belonging to my Estate.

Item 2^d. It is my will and desire that all my debts be paid out of the money due my estate next Christmas.

Item 3^d. I will that all the remainder of my estate remain in the hands of my beloved wife Mary Palmer, and herein I give her full power to sell or otherwise dispose of any part of my estate either personal or real, as she may need or circumstance may require, and that the right and title of my estate be intirely vested in her during her natural life or widowhood, at the expiration of her life, or end of her widowhood, that all of the estate be equally divided between my four children, that is to. Martha V. Palmer, and Hope P. Palmer, and William A. Palmer, Isaac O. Palmer, and Mary L. Palmer.

Item 4th. It is my will and desire, that my wife, Mary and my eldest son Hope be my executors and I do now appoint them the executors to this my last Will and Testaments, given under my hand and seal, this twenty eighth of March One Thousand eight hundred and thirty five.
