Troup County Wills 1832-1848

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Georgia Know all men by these
Troup County I, J^{ns} Walston
being in a feeble state of health knowing that
all men is obliged to die and I John Walston
being in my right mind and senses do make
my last and only will this the 29 of January
1838

First I John Walston want my wife
Sarah Walston to keep the property and the
children all together till the youngest is
with age.

Secondly - And as they marry off give them
as near equal proportion as she can

3rd And if she marries to come in an equal
part with the children and at the last one
marrying then the property to be equally
divided among my children

4th And provided my wife Sarah marries
for some person to be appointed Guardian
for the children and the property to be
taken care of for them till the time men-
tioned for a division - this is my will and
wish at this time
