I Jonathan Haralson of the County and State aforesaid, being advanced in years and knowing that death the Common lot of Man, but being of sound mind and memory

make and constitute this my Last Will and Testament, viz.

Item 1st. My will and desire is that my Just debts be first paid -

Item 2nd. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary, the Negro

and Molly and her increase after my death, One Choice Horse

One Choice Carriage and Harness, Two Choice Beds, Bedsteads

& furniture, One Desk, two Choice Tables, One Choice Shunk-

Choice lot of chains and one large armed Chair, Two Choice

Wassan, Calves, Fifty dollars in Cash, and one ninth part of the

proceeds of the sales of my Executors to be at her own disposal

After death, I also give to my beloved Wife a Woman Fanny

and her increase after my death, One brass Clock, during her

life time and at her death to be equally divided between my

children, William, Linchin & Hugh Haralson and Eunice Croming

have and share alike. -

Item 3rd. I give to Lucy Haralson wife of Vincent Haralson, deceased,

and her surviving children, by said deceased, The property and

money heretofore given to said deceased, and one ninth part of

proceeds of the sales by my Executors the said Lucy and

each surviving Child aforesaid receiving there and then alike. -

Item 4th. I give to the Heirs of the Body of my Daughter, Betsey Mavor, One

ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my Estate by my Executors to be

held by my son Herndon Haralson as a trust and to be paid over to

the Heirs as they arrive at lawfull age. -

Item 5th. I give to my Daughter, Nancy Haralson a Negro Woman

which I loaned my said Daughter about the date One thousand

two hundred and Ninety. When she removed to Tennessee with John Mavor

and family and her increase since said loan, and one ninth part of

the proceeds of the sales by my Executors to be held by my son Herndon

Haralson as a trust for the use of my Daughter, Nancy during her

life time and if said Daughter, Nancy should die, leaving no

lawfull issue, in that case it is my will that all the aforesaid

property bequeathed to her, my said Daughter, Nancy be equally

divided between my son Herndon Haralson and the Heirs of Vincent

Haralson, deceased, and the Heirs of Betsey Mavor, deceased.

One third each, my wish is that my son Herndon agent as above, see said Negro together with the living Children the may have as above as soon after my decease as practicable according to my Daughter, having the use of the interest of the proceeds during her life time, and then one third to Herndon Haralson one third to the heirs of Vincent Haralson deceased, and one third to the heirs of Betsy Thayer deceased, three and share alike to be paid by my son Herndon Haralson as they arrive at lawfull age. —

Item 6th. I give to my son Herndon Haralson one Negro man by the name of Jack together with the property and money heretofore given him, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors. —

Item 7th. I give to my son William Haralson the following Negroes viz. Bob, Abraham and Maria together with the increase of said Negroes and also all the money and property heretofore given him, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors.

Item 8th. I give to my Daughter Eunice Browning the following Negroes (viz) Lewis, Linder and Melisa and their increase, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors.

Item 9th. I give to my son Wincham L. Haralson the following Negroes (viz) Simon, Wesley and Minerva, together with the money and property heretofore given him, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors. —

It is also my Will that my son Wincham L. have the use and benefit of the farm and premises wherein I now live, together with the use of all the Horses and Stock necessary to carry on the farm, also the Corn fodder and Grain for the carrying on the farm, as also the plows gear, and farming essentials untill the twenty fifth of December, Eighteen Hundred and thirty three. — It is further my Will, that my son Wincham have the use of all my Negroes now heretofore or hereinafter, disposed of — except the Negroes left my wife (viz) Bob, Molly and Fanny and my wish is that they remain on the farm with my son Wincham untill the twenty fifth of December, Eighteen Hundred and thirty three. — and then he divide the Crop with my wife giving her for three hands a proportionable part as they may agree. —

Item 10th. I give to my son Hugh Haralson the Negroes Frank, Lucinda, and Nelson and the money and property heretofore given him, together with the ninth part of the proceeds

of the sales by my Executors.

Item 11th. My will is that the lands whereon I live and all the negroes, I may die possessed of, my stock of all kinds, House hold, furniture and not herein before disposed of, by my Executors shall so soon after the Twenty fifth of December Eighteen Hundred and thirty three, as as practicable and be equally divided between my wife, my born Children or their Heirs and Lucy Haralson, wife of Vincent Haralson, deceased, and her surviving Children by said deceased, giving said Lucy and her surviving Children the Ninth part each share and share alike, My will is that my Executors dispose of all my Estate both Real and personal not heretofore disposed of, divided equally between my wife, my born Children or their Heirs (except two ninths of the proceeds of said sale by my Executors giving to Nancy Haralson and her heirs and the Heirs of Peter Weaver &c. by John to be placed as before directed in the possession of Herndon Haralson agent as aforesaid, and to be distributed by him as heretofore directed and Lucy Haralson wife of Vincent Haralson deceased and her surviving Children by said deceased, giving said Lucy and her surviving Children each an equal part share and share alike of the Ninth part of the proceeds of the sale by my Executors, and my wife and born Children each one Ninth part as aforesaid. --

Item 12th. I do hereby and these presents, appoint and constitute my son Kinchin S. Haralson and Thomas C. Vance my Executors to carry this my last Will and Testament into execution, according to its Tenor. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this first day of December Eighteen hundred and thirty two. --

Jonathan Haralson of the County and State aforesaid, being advanced in years and knowing that death is the Common lot of Man, but being of sound mind and memory do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament as follows.

Item 1st. My will and desire is that my Just debts be first paid.

Item 2nd. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary, the Negroes Bob and Molly and her increase after my death, One Chace Horse One Beruche Carriage and Harness, Two Chace Beas, Bedsteads and furniture, One Desk, two Chace Tables, One Chace Churn. One Chace set of Chairs and one large armed Chair, Two Chace bows and balows, Fifty dollars in Cash, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my Executors to be at her own disposal at her death, I also give to my beloved Wife a Woman Fanny and her increase after my death, One brass Clock, during her life time and at her death to be equally divided between my Children, William, Kinchin & Hugh Haralson and Eunice Croming share and share alike. —

Item 3rd. I give to Lucy Haralson wife of Vincent Haralson, deceased, and her surviving Children by said deceased the property and money heretofore given to said deceased, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales by my Executors, the said Lucy and each surviving Child aforesaid receiving there and there alike. —

Item 4th. I give to the Heirs of the Body of my Daughter, Betsey Weaver one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my Estate by my Executors to be to be held by my son Herndon Haralson as a trust, and to be paid over to Heirs as they arrive at lawful age. —

Item 5th. I give to my Daughter, Nancy Haralson a Negro Woman Caithen, which I loaned my said Daughter about the date One thousand Eight Hundred and Nineteen. When she removed to Tennessee with John Mear and family and her increase since said loan, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales by my Executors to be held by my son Herndon Haralson as a trust for the use of my Daughter, Nancy during her life time and if said Daughter, Nancy should die, leaving no lawful Issue, in that Case it is my will that all the aforesaid property bequeathed to her, my said Daughter, Nancy be equally divided between my son Herndon Haralson and the Heirs of Vincent Haralson, deceased, and the Heirs of Betsey Weaver, deceased.

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One third each, my wish is that my son Herndon agent as above, see and
sign together with the living Children the may have as above as
soon after my decease as practicable according to my Daughter, being
the use of the interest of the proceeds during her life time, and then one
third to Herndon Haralson, one third to the heirs of Vincent Haralson
deceased, and one third to the heirs of Betsey Thayer deceased share
and share alike to be paid by my son Herndon Haralson as they
arrive at lawfull age. —

Item 6th. I give to my son Herndon Haralson one negro man by the
name of Jack together with the property and money heretofore
given him, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate
by my Executors. —

Item 7th. I give to my son William Haralson the following negroes viz.
Polly, Abraham and Maria together with the increase of said negroes
and also all the money and property heretofore given him, and one
ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors.

Item 8th. I give to my Daughter Eunice Browning the following
negroes (viz) Lewis, Linda, and Melisa and their increase, and
one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales of my estate by my Executors.

Item 9th. I give to my son Hinchin L. Haralson the following negroes
(viz) Limm, Wesley and Minerva, together with the money and property
heretofore given him, and one ninth part of the proceeds of the sales
of my estate by my Executors. —

This also my Will that my son Hinchin L. have the use and benefit of
the farm and premises whereon I now live, together with the use of
all the Horses and Stock necessary to carry on the farm, also the
Corn fodder and Grain for the carrying on the farm, also the
plows gear and farming essentials until the twenty fifth of Decem-
ber, Eighteen Hundred and thirty three. — This further, my Will, that
my son Hinchin have the use of all my negroes now heretofore
or hereinafter, to wit of — except the negroes left my wife (viz)
Polly, Molly and Fanny and my wish is that they remain on the
farm with my son Hinchin until the twenty fifth of December
Eighteen Hundred and thirty three. — and then he divides
the Crop with my wife giving her for three hands a proportionable
part as they may agree. —

Item 10th. I give to my son Hugh Haralson the negroes Shadrach,
Lucinda, and Nelson and the money and property heretofore
given him, together with the ninth part of the proceeds

of the sale by my Executors.

Item 11th. My will is that the lands whereon I live and all the negroes, I may die possessed of, my stock of all kinds, House hold, furniture, and not herein before disposed of, by my Executors shall so soon after the Twenty fifth of December Eighteen Hundred and thirty three, as as practicable and be equally divided between my wife, my seven Children or their Heirs and Lucy Haralson, wife of deceased Haralson, deceased, and her surviving Children by said deceased, giving said Lucy and her surviving Children one ninth part, each share and share alike. My will is that my Executors dispose of all my Estate both Real and personal not heretofore disposed of, divided equally between my wife, my seven Children or their Heirs (except two ninths of the proceeds of said sale by my Executors giving to Nancy Haralson and her heirs and the Heirs of Peter Meason, Jr. by John to be placed as before directed in the possession of Herndon Haralson agent as aforesaid, and to be distributed by him as heretofore directed) and Lucy Haralson wife of Vincent Haralson deceased, and his surviving Children by said deceased, giving said Lucy and her surviving Children each an equal part, share and share alike, of one ninth part of the proceeds of the sale by my Executors, and my wife and seven Children each one ninth part, as aforesaid. . .

Item 12th. I do hereby and these presents, appoint and constitute my son Kinchin S. Haralson and Thomas C. Hanes, my Executors to carry this my last Will and Testament into execution, according to its Tenor.
