State of Georgia I Johnathan B Lesley of said County
Franklin County and State being of sound mind and knowing
that by the course of Nature I must soon
depart this life deem it right and proper both as respects
myself and family that I should make a disposition of
the with which a kind Providence has blessed me,
do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby
revoking heretofore made by me.
I desire and direct that my body be buried in decent
and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances
in life

Item 1st Ann 2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Ann Johnson
the sum of one thousand dollars one Cow and Calf,
one bed bedstead and furniture and seven head of Hogs.
the last articles named is now in possession of said
Sarah Ann. as a loan from me said money and
property is for the sole benefit and use of said Sarah
Ann Johnson. for and during her natural life time
and then for the use of her Child or Children free and Exempt
from the debts or liabilities of her present or future husband
the above amount of one thousand dollars I request my
executors hereinafter named to lay out in lands for the use
of said Sarah Ann. and take the title in his own name, for her
use and benefit

Item 2th I give and bequeath to my daughter Calletia W Johnson the
sum of one thousand dollars one Cow and Calf one bed
bedstead and furniture seven head of Hogs the last named
articles now in her possession as a loan from me. said
money and property is for the sole benefit and separate use
of said Calletia W. for and during her natural life time
and for the use of her Child or Children free and exempt from
the debts or liabilities of her present or any future husband
I desire the money named in this article to be laid out in
the same was subject to the same control and restrictions

- (for the benefit and use of said) Calcutta as laid down in Item 2nd
- Item 4th. I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Jane Seely, one thousand dollars one bed bedstead and furniture for her sole and separate use and benefit for and during her natural life time free and exempt from the debts and liabilities of any future husbands or husbands. So long as she remains single it is my desire that my Executor hold and use the money and property named in this article for the support and benefit of said Martha Jane and should she marry then the money to be used for her benefit as in Items 2nd and 3th and managed in the same way provided said Martha Jane should die a minor without issue her portion to be equally divided amongst all my children that portions going to my daughter subject to the same Control and restrictions as in Items 2nd and 3th
- Item 5th. I give and bequeath to my son Charles W Seely, one thousand dollars also one bed bedstead and furniture
- Item 6th. I give and bequeath to my son Wiley Preston ^{Esq} one hundred dollars one bed bedstead and furniture provided he should die before arriving at lawful age and without children then all moneys in this Item to be equally divided with all my children and that portion of it going to my daughter subject to the same Management and restrictions as in Items 2nd and 3th.
- Item 7th. It is my will and desire that my land and negroes and all other property in my possession not already willed be sold to the highest bidder on twelve months credit and the proceeds applied to the payment of the legacies herein bequeathed
- Item 8th. after paying all the legacies herein named should there remain a surplus on hand I will and bequeath it to my two sons Charles W and Wiley Preston
- Item 9. I hereby appoint my Brother Peter W Seely guardian of the Person and property of my Minor son Wiley Preston
- Item 10th. I hereby appoint and constitute my Brother Peter W Seely trustee of the property and money herein given and bequeathed to my three daughters as above named in this will
- Item 11. I hereby appoint my worthy Brother P W Seely Executor of this my last will and Testament this May 22nd 1858.
