State of Georgia, in the name of
Troup County, I, Joseph Parron
of the County, State aforesaid
being sorely afflicted in body and my bodily
powers fast declining and yet being of sound
disposing mind and memory do hereby
make and ordain this my last will and
testament.

Item 1st I give and commit my body after
death to the earth to my mother and to be
buried in a decent Christian manner and
I trust, give and commit my spirit to the
Lord who gave it.

Item 2nd My will further is that so much
of my perishable property be sold as will
satisfy and pay all my just debts.

Item 3rd My will further is that the residue
of my estate both real and perishable be and
remain in the possession of my wife Sarah
Parron during her widowhood but subject
to the management, control of my executors
who are fully authorized to control, manage
and conduct all matters pertaining to my
estate, take the management of children
superintend their education and in case any
of my children should marry my executors
are hereby authorized to give to each of my
children so marrying so much of my estate
as they in their sober judgment shall deem
necessary taking into consideration at the
same time the wants and situation of the
rest of the family, but the main bulk or
body of my estate to remain together until
my youngest child arrives to the age of
twenty one years

Item 4th My will further is that if my Sarah Barron should marry and thereby change her situation or condition then and in such case my will is that my Estate all and singular be sold according to law under the Superintendance of my Said Executor and after making Sale and collecting the effects of my Estate that my wife Sarah Barron have a child's part, viz that an equal division be made betwix her and each of my children, the part belonging to my orphan children to remain in the hands of my Executor to be managed in as prosperous a way as possible

Item 5th My will further is that Alfred B. Gamy, Smith Barron and Simon Meadows act as my Executor and they are hereby appointed as such to carry this my last will and testament into effect manage & act out all the foregoing requisitions signed sealed and acknowledged

Georgia In the name of God Amen.
I Washington Taylor of the County of
Troup and State aforesaid being of sound
and disposing mind and memory thanks
be to God for the same but calling into mind
the mortality of my body do make & ordain
this and no other my last will and
testament in manner and form following, first
and principally I recommend my soul into
the hands of Almighty God and my body
I recommend to its mother dust and as
touching such worldly Estate wherewith it
has pleased God to bless me in this life
I do give devise and dispose of the same
as follows

In the first place I wish all
my negroes kept together on my plantation
until my son James Edward arrives at
Majority provided my beloved wife should
not marry and in case she should think
it expedient to marry a second time I
do give devise and bequeath unto my wife
Eleanor & my son James Edward for and
during their natural lives all my property
(except that part hereinafter named) to be
equally divided between them at her second
marriage provided God should not bless
us with a posthumous child or children -
but in the event of my beloved wife, being
safely delivered of that child or children
now in embryo I do bequeath to it or them
an equal portion of my property -

Item - As a remuneration for his services
and various other causes and considerations
I do give devise and bequeath unto my

Brother Hansell the full and just sum
of Seven hundred dollars which sum I do
will and desire should be raised on my
plantation and the sale of that portion
of my personal perishable property which
can be well spared from the plantation
and that there may be no difficulty in
the payment of that sum I do desire it paid
in Seven annual instalments each instalment
to bear a lawful interest till the same is
paid from the date or sealing of this
testament. Item To my beloved
Sister Mary Pabett and my niece
Mary Wilder I give and bequeath
each a cow and calf which I desire
delivered to them immediately after my
decease. I do hereby appoint and
constitute my brother Jordan Traylor the
Sole Executor of this my last will
and testament and I do also nominate
constitute and appoint him the Guardian
of the person and property of my child
or children (in case my wife Eleanor
should marry a second time) during his
or their minority and do wish him to act
the same part as before mentioned whether
she marries or not so far as keeping
the property together and managing the
same to profit. Lastly I do confirm
and establish this and no other to be my
last will and testament. In testimony
whereof I have herunto set my hand &
affixed my Seal this tenth day of November
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and thirty nine - Signed Sealed
