 real and personal that I possess to be
 divided and disposed of in the manner
 following viz. The first of all my after my
 just debts is paid the balance of my
 property to be kept together by my dear
 wife Martha Lane for the Support and
 education of my children say Common
 English education and as my children
 becomes of age they shall be paid by my
 Executors eight hundred dollars each out
 of my Estate in money or property at a fair
 valuation with the exception of Alexander
 my son which shall receive six hundred
 dollars as his portion and after our child
 shall receive his portion he shall receive no
 more till all the others is made equal with
 him.

I also I give and bequeath to my dear
 wife Martha Lane as her own right and
 property one of my negro women by the
 name of Hile this negro to be valued by
 my executors at a fair valuation and what
 she lacks of eight hundred dollars it shall
 be made up to her out of other property at
 a fair valuation or money by my Executors
 and at her death this property to be equally
 divided with all my children.

3rd and my wish is that my Executors
 shall procure a home for my family
 at their own discretion out of the monies
 of my Estate.

11th And do Clothe my Executors with full
power to transact all business which may be
in judgment, may be best to carry on
said comfortable and agreeable to the
interests of my estate.

I the said deceased, appoint and empower
my dear wife Martha and her heirs
Sons my Son and John Phillips
Constituents and appoint them my lawful
Executors and Executors to transact and
the above business as my last will and
testament.

I the said deceased furthermore that the Executors
Council with the executors before they trans-
act any business whatever in regard to the
estate matters.
