Dooly County, I, Mary Ann Parker of the County and State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain publish and declare the following to be and contain my last Will and Testament.

I command my soul to god who gave it and my body to be decently buried by my friends and Executors.

It is my Will that my Executors first pay all my just debts should there be any against me.

It is my desire that the property that I gave to my beloved Sister Mary Harper in her life time to Kit two negro boys and a bed and furniture remain in the same situation in which she desired it to be in her life time and a girl with her increase.

It is my Will and desire that my Niece Elizabeth Bass have and hold the property that I gave her when I first came to Georgia to Kit, a bed & furniture and a negro girl named Judith together with all her increase from the time my said Niece came into the possession of her to do with her as she may think proper.

Item 5th I hope my Nephew James W. Hill is satisfied with the provision I have already made for him and which he now has in his own hands received and enjoying! Also Nephew Polly Ann Parkman is satisfied with the provision I have already in times past made for her and which she has received in her own hands.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my Grand Niece Mary Ann Green daughter of Mary Ann Green formerly Mary Ann Hill and Frederick Green One Thousand dollars in the Note which I now hold against her father the said Frederick J. Green.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my Grand Nephew John S. Hill the note I now hold against him for six hundred and eighty dollars or some amount more that provided and with this condition that out of said Note shall be deducted by the said John S. Hill all medical services and Medicines of whatever kind rendered and administered to me and mine during my life and the said John S. Hill shall not otherwise receive pay for such Medicines and medical services. I hereby confirm the gift already made to said John S. of a negro man Charles and also of a negro man Bands already in his possession.

Item 8th I suppose a hope that my Grand Nieces Elizabeth & William is satisfied with what I have already given to her and of which she has already enjoyed the enjoyment and I also hope no Grand Niece Martha R. and Grand Nephew Allen C. Hill are satisfied with what I have already given them and upon the enjoyment of which their have already entered.

Item 9th I give and bequeath to my Great Grand Niece Mary Ann Hill daughter

together with all the other property goods chattels lands and tenements to right and
credits and cash on Hand together with every other valuable thing of which I
may die possessed except only what is hereinafter disposed of to him and
his heirs forever on account of my affection for him and because of the
continued affection kindness and attention of him and his family towards me
through life

I nominate and appoint my Grand Nephew Benjamin H. Hill to be my
Executor of this my last Will and Testament and if he should not
accept this trust then I appoint my Grand Nephew John H. Hill to be my
said Executor Intestacy whereof I the said Mary Ann Tucker have
hereby freely and voluntarily set my hand and seal this the tenth day
of January A D one Thousand Eight Hundred and fifty four / Henry
revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me made, signed,
sealed, published and declared in the presence of Testating and of real
other and the words Grand Nephew and Benjamin H. Hill were written
before signing
