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In the name of God Amen. I Mary Mcallister of the State of Georgia and County of Twig being of sound and disposing mind and memory but greatly afflicted of body and knowing that it is appointed unto all men to die, do make Codicil and Ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following
Now 1st. It is my will and desire that all of my just debts and funeral Charges should be paid.

Now 2^d. It is my will that my following negroes George, Whitley and Louisa with all of my goods and Chattels should be sold and all of my debts and dues be satisfied and after paying off all just demands against my estate for my Daughter Julia Elizabeth Dinsdale to have Ten dollars out of my Estate not for any dowry but I have for my said Daughter Julia E. but because she has an abundance of this world's goods and the balance of my Children are in needy circumstances.

Now 3^d. It is my will that the remainder of my Estate should be divided as follows viz. I wish my daughter Mary Sarah Slaughter to have fifty dollars and Mary Ann Hursey my brother's daughter to have Ten dollars.

Now 4th. The balance of my Estate not otherwise disposed of it is my will that it be equally divided one third to my Daughter Mary S. Slaughter and one third to my Daughter Simeon E. White and one third to my three dear and Children Charles Matthew Harvey, James P. Harvey and Mary Ann Harvey the Children of my deceased daughter Martha Ann Hursey.

Now 5th. It is my will that my said Grand Daughter Mary Ann shall have my silver Tea Spoons and my Feather Bed.

Now 6th. I do here by appoint my son in Law William M. Slaughter my lawful Executor to this my said last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and annul all former wills or Codicils heretofore made by me
