all of my goods and Chattels should be sold and all of my debts and exec
be collected and after paying off all just demands against my estate for my
Daughter Julia Elizabeth Dinskill to have Ten dollars out of my Estate not for
any disrespect I have for my said Daughter Julia E. but because she has an
abundance of this world good and the talents of my children are in Kennedy Circumstances.
Item 3rd It is my will that the remainder of my Estate should be divided
as follows 1st I think my daughter Mary Brown Slaughter to have fifty
dollars and Henry and Harriet my Grand daughters to have Ten dollars.
Item 4th The balance of my Estate not otherwise disposed of it is my will
that it be equally divided one third to my Daughter Mary S. Slaughter and
one third to my Daughter Sarah P. White and one third to my three son
and Children Charles Morris Harvey, James P. Harvey and Mary Ann Harvey
the children of my deceased daughter Martha Ann Harvey.

Item 5th It is my will that my said Grand Daughter Mary Ann shall have
my Silver Tea Service and my Bed.

Item 6th I do here by appoint my son in Law William H. Slaughter my
Last Executor to this my said Last Will and Testament and I do hereby revoke
any former instrument all former Wills or Codicils heretofore made by me
in writing whereof I have hereto set my hand and affixed my seal this the
5th day of November 1851
