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Georgia 3. Iov the Name of God Amen.

Troup County, 3. I Mary Pentecost being advanced in years as well as afflicted in body but of sound and disposing mind and judgment know
w^eing that I must sooner or later go the way of all the earth doon et night
and further that I shoule dispose of such property as a merciful handme
has given me I therefore make this my last will and testament.
At my death I direct my body to be buried in a plain and Christian
like manner my soul & this will return to God who gave me existence
through the grace of Jesus Christ.

2. I will and desire that my just debts be paid by my Executors hereafter
named with as little delay as profitable.

3. I will and desire that my said Executors sell my Negro boy Tom to
the best advantage he can be so as to give said boy the privilege of choo-
sing his home and that he give the said boy fifty dollars in money out
of the amount for which he sells.

4. I will and bequeath to my beloved sister Elizabeth Stotius the balance
of the amount of the said boy for after giving him fifty dollars as
above stated as long as she lives and at her death to be equally divided
between her children. I also give and bequeath unto my beloved sister
Sarah Stotius twenty dollars out of what is coming to me in Troup
County via this state. I also give and bequeath unto my sister Nancy
Watts twenty dollars out of what is coming to me in Troup County
and State aforesaid. I also give and bequeath to my Sister Abigail
Ninety dollars out of what is coming to me in Troup County
and State aforesaid. I also give and bequeath the remainder of what is
coming to me in Troup County to my beloved Sister Elizabeth
Stotius.

5. It is also my will and desire that my sister Elizabeth Stotius take care
of and support my beloved brother Brown Brad by during his life
time in consequence of which I bequeath that portion of my estate that
I shoule have otherwise have given to him.

6. I hereby appoint and constitute my beloved brother Law Sam C. Stotius
husband of my sister Elizabeth Stotius Executor to this my last
will and testament. this 24th of June 1862.
