Georgia. In the name of God Amen.

of life and the certainty of death, do make, con-
stitute and ordain this my last will and testament
merely revoking all other former wills, making
them null & void.

Imprimis. I recommend my Soul unto the hands
of my most merciful Creator the author of its
existence, and my body to be interred at the
discretion of my friends and Executors in the
usual decent manner of burying the dead.

Secondly. It is my desire and will is that all
my just debt should be paid by my Executors.

Thirdly. I will that all my negroes, household
furniture and stock of every kind, should be sold
and the money arising from the proceeds of the
sale equally divided among, Respdy James wife
of William James, Elizabeth L Greer wife of Leonard
Greer, Cynthia C Hanley wife of Ezekiel Hanley,
Martha H Greer wife of Gilbert Greer & Sally M
Thornton and Nancy C Thornton & Maria M
Dixon my three grand daughters shall share
alike; the three above named grand daughters
to have one fifth part, a, a child, legacy between
them.

Fourthly. I bequeath the Lot of Land known
by number two hundred and twenty one whereon I
last resided in the County & State aforesaid unto
William James

Fifthly I bequeath unto Margaret D Swinney
five dollars she having received her legacy
already; by the hands of her husband William H
Swinney.

Sixthly I hereby nominate and appoint Gilbert

John and William Barnes my legal Executors
to carry the same will into effect agreeable
to the meaning and tenor thereof.
