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The last will & testament of Moses Freeman

Troup County wills 1832-1848

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In the name of God Amen.

I Moses Freeman of the State of Georgia County of Troup being of Sound and disposing mind but knowing that man is mortal and must die do make certain constitute and appoint this my last will and testament, revoking all others, and as touching my worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me I give demise & bequeath in the following manner to wit-

First of all I desire that my debts be paid who are but few and none of magnitude

Secondly. My will and desire is that my beloved wife Henrietta M. Freeman have all the rest of my estate consisting of the following property to wit, one gray horse and a bay mare together with notes of hand on Jacob Freeman and Moses Wilkes to the amount of four hundred and fifty dollars, together with my present crop of corn & fodder together with all household & kitchen furniture - and

Lastly. I now nominate and appoint John Wilkes and Charles Vickers my Executors to see to and carry into effect this my will Given under my hand and Seal this

26th day of October A.D. 1838
