

94 The last will and testament of Peggy Pledsor dec^d.

Troup County Wills 1832-1848

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Georgia In the name of God Amen.
Troup County I Margaret or Peggy Pledsor
of the County & State above named being weak
in body but of sound and disposing mind and
memory and knowing that it is appointed unto
all to die and having worldly goods which I
wish to dispose of before my death do make &
declare this my last will and testament hereby
revoking and declaring all other wills made
by me heretofore null and void.

That is to say -

Item first - My soul I will to God who
gave it trusting through his mercy and
goodness that it may be received into ever-
lasting happiness and repose My body to
be decently buried in a style and manner
suited to my circumstances in life

Item second - It is my desire and I do
hereby will that all my just debt, which
I now own or which may hereafter be contrac-
ted by me be paid by my Executor herein
after named -

Item third - I give and bequeath to my son
Peggy Pledsor my two negro women Crecy
& Frances as some compensation to him for
the care he has taken of me and for the
trouble he may yet have

Item fourth - It is my will and desire
that my negro woman Jenny be sold by my
Executor hereinafter named and the proceeds
to be equally distributed between my four chil-
dren Nancy Bailey, Peter Ogburn, William
Pledsor and Peggy Pledsor

Item fifth - It is my will and desire that
all my household and kitchen furniture
my bay mare saddle and bridle together

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with my stock of cattle and hogs be sold by my Executor herein after named and the proceeds to be equally distributed between my four children above named.

Item Sixth - In order that this my Last Will and Testament may be duly executed according to the true intent and meaning thereof I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my son Peachy Pleasor my Executor desiring him not to decline but to qualify and act as such - In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this eighth day of August in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty eight
