and declare this to be my last Will & Testament, that is to say first after all my lawful  
debts are paid and discharged the residue of my estate real and personal I give  
bequeath and dispose of as follows to wit

Newt D. <sup>to</sup> Sabra and bequeath all my property both real and personal is to be equally divided  
amongst all my children, I hereby appoint and ordain James M. Hopsow and  
Briggs W. Hopsow my executors to carry out my last Will and Testament  
after my decease my executors are to dispose of my property both real and  
personal by public sale or private sale which ever they may think will  
be to advantage and interest of all my heirs, to witness whereof I have  
hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this the 21<sup>st</sup> day of Nov  
ember 1854 <sup>Sabra Hopsow</sup>

The above written instrument was subscribed by the said Sabra Hopsow  
in our presence and acknowledged by her to each of us and she at the same  
time published and declared the above instrument to be her  
Last Will and Testament and we at the Testator's request and in her presence  
we have signed our names as witnesses unto <sup>James S. Phillips</sup>

Georgia <sup>3</sup> Court of Ordinary May Term 1858  
To my County <sup>3</sup> The last Will & Testament of Sabra Hopsow late of Said  
County deceased having been propounded by James M.  
Hopsow one of the executors nominated therin, for Probate and Said  
Executor having produced in open court James S. Phillips, Edward Allens  
and William G. Sims subscribing witness to said Will who being  
 duly sworn depose and say that at the time of the deposition publishing  
and declaring said Will said Testator was of sound & disposing  
mind and memory and executed same freely voluntarily and by  
her own accord without any undue influence whatever and all other  
facts & circumstances connecting with said Will having been  
proven fully to the satisfaction of the Court. It is ordered that said  
last Will & Testament of said Sabra Hopsow Deed be admitted  
to Record and that James M. Hopsow do qualify as Executor  
by taking the oath prescribed by Law, all of which being done  
in open Court Letters Testamentary now granted said James  
M. Hopsow as the Statute in such cases provides.
