 I dispose of as follows

Item 2nd To my beloved wife Susan Samsly I give and bequeath
 the following property to wit her male and female
 Buggy and Cart and Calf one Sire and Sigs of which
 she holds Charge and I let her sell from the stock
 I may die possessed of an Ox and Stead and
 all the furniture that she has had here we have
 been married together with an Bureau her large Chest
 one year supply of provisions and three hundred

Dollars if may so soon as the may can be raised
 by the following provisions of my will
 Item 3rd It is further my will that after my death all of the
 property I may die possessed of and not disposed
 of by me in the second item of this will shall be

publicly advertised and sold to the highest bidder
According to Law on one year as Crittelle and others
Collected together with any debts that may be owing to me
at the time of my decease and after paying all demands
against me the remainder to be equally divided
between my wife Susan and my said daughter Pleasant
John Nathan Stanton Samntan Wadsworth George W
Frances M and William S Daniels and my daughter
Mortha Roman and my daughter Nancy Hannah during
her natural life and then to be living children and
my daughter Mary Gorus two children George and Nettie
Dobson

this will is executed to effect it is my will that the
property herein bequeathed to her shall vest to my
estate and be divided among my children and grand
children as before mentioned

It is my desire that my sterner friend John S. Bapst
and my wife Susan be appointed to execute this
my last will and testament in witness whereof I
the said Susan formally bear to this my will in my
hand and seal this 30 day of March 1858
