Georgia, Troup County. I Jacob Stillwell of the State and
County aforesaid. Do make ordain and declare this to be my last
Will and testament, revoking all others.

Item 1st I will that all my debts are to be punctually paid.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Anne Stillwell, My land
whereon I now live, containing sixty acres more or less, being
part of lot N. & 75, Seventy five in the 13th District, originally came
County now Troup, One negro man named Jacob, one negro
woman named Anna, their beds, Bed Slids and furniture
five Cows and Calves, One hoss of Stars, two Margarets, One
the other Gray, all the household and Kitchen furniture.
And all my stock of Hogs, after her death, and equal distribution
of said property to be made between my legal heirs.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath unto Sarah Auckley one negro boy named
Willie which she has had in her possession.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Gile, the negro
girl named Susan which she has now in her possession, also
Two hundred and Twenty five dollars. That her Husband Peter Gile
is indebted to me.

Item 5th I give and bequeath unto my son John Stillwell, the negro man named
Anderson.

Item 6th I give and bequeath unto my son Reuben Stillwell his heirs, the negro
boy named Randal.

Item 7th I give and bequeath unto my son Green Stillwell, the negro boy named
William.

Item 8th I will that the balance of my negroes be sold and an equal
distribution of the amount of sale be made between my
full heirs (obj) One negro man named Jiss, the negro woman
named Rachael, one negro boy named Jim, One girl named
Cynthia, One negro girl named Oliza, One negro girl named
Phasla, one negro boy named William. I wish for Jiss and
Rachael to choose their Master.

Item 10th I will that all the Surplus Parishable property to be sold, and
like distribution to be made.

Item 11th I will that my executors sell the two tracts of Land drawn
by me in the late land lottery in the Cherokee country and
after paying the expenses, a like distribution to be made.

I do now appint and ordain John Hillwell, Ruben Hillwell, To be my legal
Executors, and my wife ~~to be~~^{Troup County Wills 1832-1848} witness to this my last
Will and Testament. In testimony, I have hereunto set my
hand and seal, this thirteenth day of July One thousand and Eighty-
four and thirty three, and of the Indepedance of the united
States the fifty seventh.

 remainder of my Estate, both real and personal and do hereby con-
 stitute and appoint my Brother Joseph D. M^r. Farland my lawfull
 Executor to carry this my last Will and testament, into full execution.
 Given under my hand and seal, this the twentieth day of January 1835.
