I William Hinson being
much afflicted in body have thought proper
to make this my last will.

First I commit my soul to God
who gave it.

2^d I give in charge all my property
both real and personal to my wife Elizabeth
for the support and raising of my children
and as they become of age or marry to take
of their part of the then valuation of my
Estate the balance to be kept together as
a family till the youngest child becomes of
age, and if my wife should think proper
to change her situation, then an equal distri-
bution, her taking a child's part, and I
give her right of choosing three discreet
persons to make a distribution whenever ne-
cessary, always considering my wife as an
heir in the distribution when a part taken
off.

I nominate and appoint my friend
John W. McGee my Executor to this my last
will, and I give him power to sell any
part of the Estate when he may think it
best for my wife and children.
