7th Item. I give and bequeath and devise to my son Rowland
 W. Hudson the balance of my stock of Cattle also the balance
 of my stock of Hops and all of my Pork or Bacon on hand
 also all of my Corn on hand also my Cotton on hand also
 the balance of my household and kitchen furniture.

8th Item. I give and bequeath and devise to Rowland
 W. Hudson my own all my entire interest and claims in the
 Estate of Richard Hudson deceased.

9th Item. I also appoint Rowland W. Hudson my son
 my Executor to this my last will and testament.

The Last Will and Testament of John Moody Sr.

Georgia - In the name of God Amen!
 I John Moody Sr. of said State and
 County being of advanced age and knowing that I
 must shortly depart from this world deem it right
 and proper both as respects myself and family that
 I should make a disposition of the property with which
 a kind providence has blessed me. I therefore make
 this my last Will and Testament.

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
 decent and Christian-like manner suitable to my
 circumstances -

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
 by my Executor hereafter named.

Item 1st I desire that my property all be kept together for the
 present year and the proceeds of the crop to be applied to
 my debts. In case that they should not be enough to
 pay my debts I desire that my Executor shall sell a negro
 boy named Isaac for the purpose of paying me my just debts.

Item 2nd I desire and direct to my beloved wife Sarah, the planta-
 tion upon which I now reside and together with all my
 negroes except three which will hereafter be pointed out
 and all my stock, plantation tools, household furniture
 to have unto to hold during her natural life or widowhood
 for the purpose of raising and schooling my minor
 children.

Item 3rd I give and devise to my three older children namely: Eph-
 raiah and Ellen, three negroes: Nancy, George and Fanny
 said negroes are to be appraised and drawn for, those
 drawing the most valuable are to pay back nothing they
 are equal. And I further desire as my younger children
 come of age that they shall be made equal with
 my three older children -
