Gray County I know all men by these presents that I Thomas J. Jones
of the aforesaid County and State being of sound mind
and disposing memory do make execute and declare this to be my last
Will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me
My Will and desire is after my death my body to be buried in a Christian
like manner.

Item 1st My Will and desire is that all my just debts be promptly paid out of my
Estate as my Executor and Executrix may desire.

Item 2nd My Will and desire is that all my just debts be promptly paid out of my
Estate as my Executor and Executrix may desire.
I give and bequeath to my eldest son William J. Jones when he shall
have arrived at the age of Twenty one years One Thousand Dollars in
Money and one valuable negro man and a negro girl the girl to be Ten
or Twelve years old and a mule or Horse to be worth One Hundred or
One Hundred and Twenty five Dollars the good feather Bed and furniture
and Cow and Calf, sow and pigs & a pair of good young Oxen and Cart
but if in the opinion of my Executor and Executrix the above named is more
than the amount of my Estate will warrant this Item shall be less a negro
girl, but if in the mean time my Estate, and my Executor and Executrix should
think proper at any time after this period and before the next child becomes of
age they may give my son William J another negro girl six or seven years
old.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my Son John H. Jones, James T. Jones, Thomas J.
Jones and Ichabod P. Jones each as they may become of age the same amount of
money and property as specified in the third for my Son William J. Jones with
the same restrictions and specialties.

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my Wife Winney Jones for the especial use benefit
and behoof of my afflicted child Elizabeth J. Jones her natural lifetime Two
Thousand Dollars in Money and One negro woman woman to be selected by
my Wife or Executor at the time my youngest child becomes of age or sooner
if then should be a distribution of my Estate.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Wife Winney Jones out of the residue of my Estate
after my youngest child shall become of age Three Thousand Dollars in
Money a negro woman by the name of Ally and another negro woman such
as she may select with their increase afterwards and Two negro men such as
she may select, a negro girl about Ten years old such as she may select together
with one years provisions also such a quantity Household and Kitchen furniture
plantation implements Hayow Carriage and Stock of all kinds as she may think
proper and necessary for her comfort in the event that my wife Winney Jones
should marry what ever may be contained in this Item over and above a
childs part of my Estate shall revert to and be equally divided among my
children except the negro woman Ally which is to remain during her natural
lifetime and then revert back into my Estate and be equally divided among my
children together with her increase.

Item 6th It is my desire and Will that should my Executor and Executrix think it bene-
ficial for the interest of my Estate to sell or change any species of property
which I may have been possessed of or should Circumstances allow them to
purchase any species of property with funds which may arise from the
income of my Estate I do hereby authorize them to do so as fully and effec-
tually as if I had done it myself provided always my Executor and Executrix
shall concur in any transaction.

Item 7th I desire that if my two old negroes Gilbert and Dave should be alive at
the time of my death they shall be sold.

Item 8th If at any time after my death my Wife should marry again I desire that my entire estate should be equally divided between her and my children with the exception that the wooden holly is to be reverted to my estate after the death of my wife to be divided equally among my children

Item 9th I declare that the residue of my estate both personal and Real should be equally divided between my five sons named in Item third and fourth

Item 10th I do hereby appoint my wife Anna Jones my Executor and her Brother Joseph Pendle my Executor to execute this my Last Will and Testament As Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the Twenty day of October eighteen hundred and fifty five, signed, sealed, published the above year at my written before us and in the presence of
