The Last Will & Testament
of Archey Whatley dec'd

In the name of God Amen
I, Archey Whatley of the State of Georgia
and county of Troup being of sound and
disposing mind and memory but knowing
that man is mortal and has once to die
I do therefore make ordain constitute and
appoint this to be my last will and
testament revoking all others and as
touching my worldly Estate wherewith it
hath pleased God to bless me with
I give and bequeath demise & dispose of
the same in the following manner to wit
First of all after paying my just debts
which are but few and none of great
magnitude I give unto my beloved wife
Fanny Whatley all of the household &
kitchen furniture with all my farming
tools of cart, horses, hogs, cattle and
of every description to dispose of as
they may think proper.
I now lend unto her my wife during
her life time or widowhood one hundred
and thirty acres of land it being the East
half of Lot Number twenty three in the
Fifteenth district of originally Carroll
but now Troup County whercon I now
live with thirty acres off of Number Sixty
in said district adjoining my dwelling.
Secondly - at the marriage or death
of my wife Fanny Whatley I give unto
my son Willis J. Whatley the same land
that I lend to my wife to wit the East
half of Lot twenty three in the fifteenth
district of said County with thirty acres
of Lot Number Sixty in said district
forward

Thirdly I give to my son Robert Whatley
Ten dollars - to my daughter Rebecca
Tensions ten dollars - to my daughter Elizabeth
ten dollars - to my daughter
Temperance three ten dollars also to my
son in law Benjamin P. White in right
of my daughter Ann White who is dead
Five dollars -

Fourthly - I desire and so direct one
hundred acres of land it being the west
half of the before mentioned lot Number
Seventy three in the fifteenth District of
said County with two negroes to wit Peter
a man and Phill a woman be sold at
public outcry the usual way of selling prop-
erty on twelve months credit if my
Executor thinks proper and the proceeds
equally divided between my other children
and one grand daughter to wit Mary Jane
White my son Troup County Wills 1818-1848

Fifthly - My desire is that my daughter
Fanny Whatley shall act as guardian
for the said Mary Jane White minor
and in the event that Mary Jane should
die before she shall arrive at the age
of eighteen years then the said Fanny
Whatley shall have the distributive share
of the said Mary Jane White -

Sixthly - My will is that if ~~any~~ my
son Willis J. Whatley shall pay into the
Estate agreeable to the terms of the afore-
mentioned Sale the Sum of Four
hundred and fifty dollars that he
shall have the west half of lot Number
Seventy three in the fifteenth district in
the place of selling the same as above
forwards

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provided for and lastly I now
nominate and appoint my beloved
wife Fanny Whatley my Executrix &
my beloved son Willis J. Whatley my
Executor to see to and carry into full
effect this my last will & testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal
this twelfth day of October eighteen
hundred and forty six
