

William Moon deceased. Will.

Troup-County Wills 1832-1848

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Georgia & Joseph County. Behold all men by these Presents, that I William Moon of the State and County aforesaid, do make and declare this to be my last will and Testament. Viz.

I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Moon the half lot of land which I bought of Henry Henderson, being the east half of Lot No. 37, in the 12th District of the County aforesaid, during her natural life or bedchamber - and in case she should wish to move at any time, and if my Executors, should think it advisable, is it my Will that they have power to sell the aforesaid land, and buy other land as they may think best, and for its to be subject to the same regulations as the land aforesaid.

And it is my will further, that William H. Sparks, Vanina Sparks, and James Sparks, orphans of John Sparks, deceased, of the State of Alabama, receive fifty dollars out of my estate, to be paid to them by my Execs. as they become of age; the said fifty dollars to be equally divided among them as aforesaid.

And it is further my will, that in order that my wife Nancy Moon, may have an improvement made on the said half lot, of land; that she keep the family and property all together during the next ensuing Crop season, then it is my will that my said Executors proceed according to the laws of our State in such Cases made and provided, regulating the Management, and distribution of estates, with all my estate, both real and personal not named above.

And it is further my will, that my said Executors be authorized, and empowered, at any time before a sale, sale or distribution of my said estate, to sell or dispose of any part of my parishable property, which they may think best, or as most advantageous to my said estate or legatees thereof; and that they make due and regular returns of any such private sale or sales which they may make as aforesaid.

And it is my will further that Henry J. Henderson, Elijah Neazey and my wife Nancy Moon, be my Executors and Executrix to bring this my will into effect.
