In open Court, Given under my hand and Common Seal
the nominated Executors of the last will and testament of Bennett-
Postgates deceased, and was duly Qualifid as the Executors of the said
Will of the said deceased, by taking the Oath as prescribed by law
in such Cases, and on motion, it is ordered by the Court that this
Will with all its proceedings, be recorded.

William Nelson dae Will.

State of Georgia
Troup County. In the name of God. Amen.

I William Nelson of the County and State aforesaid being
of sound mind and memory do make and Ordain this my
last will and testament viz. to the property wherewith it has
pleased God to bless me with, I dispose of it in manner and
form following:

Item First, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Gracy
a part of fractional lots of Land Number one hundred and
fifty & one hundred and fifty one in the fifteenth district
formerly Carroll now Troup County, which is to say all that
part lying on the south side of Martha Creek wherein my
dwelling house now stands with all my house hold and kitchen
or furniture, except two bess and furniture and after her
death to go to my son Hardy L. Nelson, my farming uten-
tials, ten Cows and Calves, one Yoke of Oxen and Cart,
Forty head of Stock hogs and two good farm horses, and five
negroes to wit, Ben a man about thirty four years old and
Aurora about twenty eight years old and her two children
Francis and Silvey, one about eight years old, and the other

about five years old and William a boy about thirteen years old, I also
give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Lafap
Twenty Dollars.

Item: Second; I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Lafap
Ten Dollars.

Item: Third; I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Bates
Ten Dollars.

Item: Fourth; I give and bequeath unto my son Hardys Nelson lots of land
numbers one hundred and forty seven in the sixteenth District formerly
Carrol now Grouper County and all that part of lots number one
hundred & fifty and one hundred and fifty one, lying on the west
side of the Nechadaha Creek, in the fifteenth District formerly Car
rol, now Grouper County; also One hundred and fifty six and One
hundred and fifty seven in the fifteenth District formerly Carrol now
Grouper County; and one hundred and fifty head of Stock Cattle;
one one negro boy named Little Frank about sixteen years old
One good horse bridle and saddle, and one bed and furniture.

Item: Fifth; I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Nancy Nelson One
Thousand Dollars in Cash, and a negro Girl named Jenny about
thirteen years old, fifty head of Stock Cattle, and one Good Horse
bridle and saddle, and one bed and furniture.

Item: Sixth; I give and bequeath the balance of my property, both
real and personal, not herein before disposed of, after the pay
ment of my just debts unto my two sons John H. and Hardys
and my three Daughters Matilda, Margaret and Elizabeth
Harrison and Nancy Nelson, to be equally divided amongst
them.

And I do hereby appoint William Garrison, William Moore
and Winston Wood my executors to this my last Will
and Testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal, this eighth day of April eighteen hundred
and thirty three.
