William Rigby son and Will.

Georgia Group County. Know all men by these presents, that I William
Rigby Sen. of the State and County aforesaid, being sensible of my declining
years, and that according to the Course of Nature, I cannot live much
longer, in this world. I do therefore make and declare the following to be
my last Will and Testaments Viz. I give and bequeath all my estate
both real and personal to my wife, Mary Rigby during her natural
life or widowhood, and in case of her marrying again, then for the
whole to be sold at publick sale, and to be equally divided among my
Children herein after mentioned, and my said wife, she receiving an equal
part with one of my said Children. And in case she does not marry,
it is my will that at her death, the whole be sold as aforesaid, and
equally divided among my Children Viz. Elizabeth Roe, Jolly Roe, Samy
Isak Vincy Jackson, William Rigby, Allen Rigby, Isak Rigby, Edi Rigby,
Alford Rigby, Mary Rigby, Harriet Bays and Huldah Salomon. It is
further, my will, that my unmarried Children, receive something as they
marry to help them towards house keeping, of whatever can be spared
at the time. And in order that an equal division be made, it is my
will, that all my Children that have received and those who may receive
any thing as aforesaid, render a true account of the same on a division
of my said estate, with the exception of one pale ready Crock and Calf, which I
give and bequeath to my youngest Daughter, Mary Rigby, which she is
not to account for. And it is further my will, that Sarah Roe and
Thomas Jackson, by my Executors to bring this my Will into effect, given
under my hand and seal, this 2nd June 1834.

In open Court the last will and Testament of William Rigby sen. deceased was exhibited for probate - and on Motion of the heirs by the oath of Jephtha Witherson and Cyrus R. Jenkins, two of the subscribing witnesses to said Will. . . You Jephtha Witherson and Cyrus R. Jenkins - you and each of you do solemnly swear upon the holy Evangelist of Almighty God; that you saw William Rigby sen. sign seal publish and declare this instrument of Writing to be and contain the last will and Testament of the said decd. And that he was of sound mind and disposing memory. And that he did it with Compulsion, And of his own free will. . . And that you saw Ann W. Witherson sign with your selves as subscribing Witnesses to the same, and at the request of the Testator and in the presence of each other, so help you God.

Sworn to in open Court and subscribed before me, 2^d November 1835.
