William Rigby late sur. Will.

Georgia Graysville County. - Know all men by these presents, that William Rigby, Lmt. of the State and County aforesaid, being sensible of my declining years, and that according to the course of nature, I cannot live much longer in this world. I do therefore make and declare the following to be my last Will and Testament Viz. I give and bequeath all my estate both real and personal to my wife Mary Rigby during her natural life or widowhood, and in case of her marrying again, then for the whole to be sold at publick sale, and to be equally divided among my Children herein after mentioned, and my said wife, she receiving an equal part with one of my said Children. And in case she does not marry, it is my will that, at her death, the whole be sold as aforesaid, and equally divided among my Children. Viz. Elizabeth Roe, Tolly Roe, Nancy Roe, Lucy Jackson, William Rigby, Helen Rigby, Noah Rigby, Eli Rigby, Alford Rigby, Mary Rigby, Cassandra Bayard and Hubbard Patterson. It is further my will, that my unmarried Children, receive something as they marry to help them towards house keeping, of whatever can be spared at the time. And in order that an equal division be made, it is my will, that all my Children that have received and those who may receive anything as aforesaid, render a true account of the same on a division of my said estate, with the exception of the pale road, Cow & Calf, which I give and bequeath to my youngest Daughter, Mary Rigby, which she is not to account for. And it is further my will, that David Roe and Thomas Jackson, by my Executors, to bring this my Will into effect, sign under my hand, and seal, this 9th June 1834.

other to help you God .
