Item first, I desire that fifty acres or less of the west end of lot No. 18 in the 17th dist and five rods to the condition line between Union County and my neighbor James Satterfield 1877-1890

to the dry land ditch thence up said ditch to the fence, thence down the fence to the bridge, thence up the branch to the original line equally divided between my two little grand children Kenneth Spurlin and Robert L. Stern second. And I hereby appoint and constitute Thomas C. Hughes my executor to carry into effect this my last will and testament.
