Know ye that on the first day of May in the
Year of our Lord, Methousand Eight hundred and Sixty five
the last, Will and testament of John G. Parkes, late of
said County, deceased, was exhibited in open Court, it being
a regular term thereof, and in common form of law, proved
and admitted to record, a copy of which is hereunto annexed,
and administration of all and singular the goods, chattels and
credits of said deceased, was granted to Mrs. El Doris and John
W. Parkes, the Executors in and by said will named and
appointed, they having first taken the oath, and performed
all other requisites required by law, they are by order of said
Court, and by virtue of these presents, legally authorized to ad-
minister the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, according
to the tenor and effect of the said Will and Testament, and
according to law.

And they are hereby required to render a true and perfect
inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of
the said deceased, and appraised and return to this Court according
to law, and to render a true and correct account to the said Court
of his actions and doings, yearly and every year, until their
administration is fully completed.

Copy of John G. Parkes Will

Georgia } In the name of God Amen
Franklin County } I John G. Parkes of the County and State
aforesaid being sick and weak in body but of sound mind
and disposing memory do make this my last will and testament revoking
all former wills by me made.

- 1st of all, I desire that all my just debts be paid
- 2^d I will and bequeath after the payments of my just debts all the property both real and personal of every kind unto my well beloved wife Elizabeth Parkes for her own use and benefit for and during her natural life or widow hood, in the event of her marriage then it is my will that all the property shall be sold or divided if such can be done amongst all my children and my wife equally, share and share alike of my wife should not again marry then at her death all the property remaining to be equally divided amongst my children then living or their children.
- 3^d It is my will that my wife should give off to my children not married and now with us who have had nothing but they shall have a good house each and such bedding and house furniture to make them equal with those who have married off
- 4th It is my will that should any of my daughters become widows and without a home that they have a home or lands during their lifetime or widowhood of their brother
- 5th It is my will that my executors herein after named shall sell my property so they die possessed of privately if they deem it best to do so
- 6th It is my will that my executors shall repay all the property without appraisement and sell only such as is necessary to the payment of my debts unless my wife should not wish to move back to Union County then they are at liberty to sell my lands there and lay or invest the money in lands elsewhere as she may desire
- 7th I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my brother-in-law Thomas Morris & my son John W. Parkes executors to this my last will and testament
