Last Will & Testament of

William Sullivan Deed

Georgia
Union County

I this day June fifteenth 1881 make
this my last will and Testament

My 1st I give and bequeath to my beloved
wife Rebecca Sullivan - all of lot of Land No
two hundred and fifty six (256) with Dist
and first sect of said County, which is not
deducted to D. A. Sullivan Missa L. Ingram, Sarah
M. Covert and Sophia C. McLean & Elizabeth
Sullivan - containing 10 acres more or less including
my present residence - Meets and bounds as follows
commencing on the original East North & South
line at the conditional corner described in a
deed from William Sullivan to D. A. Sullivan
thence North along said line to the conditional
corner specified in a deed from Wm Sullivan to
Sarah Covert and Sophia C. McLean - thence
West down the ridge with said conditional line
to the creek at the mouth of the branch - thence
down the creek to the old land mentioned in a
deed from William Sullivan to Elizabeth Sullivan
to the line described in a deed from William
Sullivan to Missa L. Ingram - thence due South
with the Ingram line to the creek - thence
down the creek to the mouth of the branch
coming down by D. A. Sullivan's house -
thence with the conditional line made in
a deed from William Sullivan to D. A. Sullivan
to the Beginning Point - also about 15 acres
of the same lot No 256, in the South west
corner of said lot meets and bounds as follows
commencing in the South west corner - thence
east with original to the conditional line
described in a deed from William Sullivan
to D. A. Sullivan - thence due North with
conditional to fence on top of the ridge
which is another conditional line made
in a deed from William Sullivan to D. A.

conditional to the original West, North & South line at white oak tree thence South along original line to the beginning point = Also 10 acres more or less of lot of land No 283 in the 9th Dist - 1st Sec of said County unto and unto and bounds as follows commencing at the North West corner of said lot thence east to the conditional line made in deed from William Sullivan to D. A. Sullivan thence South to the conditional line described in a deed from William Sullivan to William A. Sullivan thence North West with said conditional line to the beginning point =

I further give and bequeath unto the said Rebecca Sullivan all of the personal property of which I am now or may before my death become in possession of together with all of the house hold and kitchen furniture =

I further give and bequeath unto the said Rebecca Sullivan a Note due me from Daniel A. Sullivan for \$200.00 to be paid to her along as she may need it = But in the event that she can live comfortably without the use of said two hundred dollars = or whatever amount of it remains unpaid at her death I give and bequeath to my son Daniel A. Sullivan =

I further will that at the death of my wife Rebecca Sullivan the land given to her in this will = and all of the personal property she may have together with household and kitchen furniture, be sold and the proceeds divided equally with all of my heirs

I hereby appoint Daniel A. Sullivan and John J. Odum Executors of this my last will and Testament = Signed and Sealed this the 15th June 1881 in presence of James W. Smith
