day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight hundred
and forty two, and that whereas I being in a low state of health, but of
proper sound mind do think fit and proper to make some disposition
of my worldly goods or effects, and now in the name of God
I want all my just debts paid, I wish all the property I now
possess or own either in notes due or money on hand, to be
sold and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided
between my three Children herein named (to wit,) Jesse Stephens
my son in law, William Stephens my son in law and Roswell
my son, with the exception of the land on which I now live,
that I wish, those my Children named above to have the right
to appoint three disinterested persons to divide the same and draw
for if it be their pleasure so to do and also, out of the property
alluded to above I wish my wife, Nancy Powell to have our
negro woman named Lucinda One bed bedstead and furniture
One folding Table and one small walnut Desk, to have in her
own right to will and dispose of at her pleasure, I wish for my
(wife) also to have the privilege of living or boarding at any place
she may Chose and to be supported out of the monies arising from
said estate, I wish also that David Edmunds of said County being
an object of Charity to have Ten dollars per annum for five years
Ames, and now I do truly appoint Jesse Stephens and Roswell Powell
my Executors to carry this my last will and Testament into effect forthwith
after my death —
