my last will and testament in the manner and form following. First

to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors herein after
named. and my worldly estate I give and devise as follows.

I give and devise to my beloved wife Charity Walker the following property
viz Abraham, Sarah the wife of Abraham and her Chils Luke, Bob,
Yellow Jane, Yellow Minney, Hannah, Sally, and Wat, all the stock
of whatever it may consist, all the household & kitchen furniture
all the farming tools, the tract of land whereon I now live containing
one thousand twelve and one half acres formed of lot No Fifty two fifty
three and eighty five lying in the tenth district formerly Monroe now
Lipson County No three and forty seven lying in the sixteenth district
formerly Houston now said County Lipson with the appertinences thereto
belonging, the personal property so devised to my beloved wife Charity
Walker to be disposed of as she may think proper, but the real property
devised to her as above stated, after her death to be equally divided between
my two sons Nathaniel F Walker and Allen M Walker as their right
and property.

also I give and devise to my son William W Walker old Danie,
Rebecca, Ned, Anthony, old John, Susan, Bledoor, Jessie, Black Minney,
Sam, Cain, Dinah, & Lunah.

also I give and devise to my son Nathaniel F Walker, Dow, Phoebe,
Ellin, Darcas, Peggy, little John, Vines and her children Herbert,
Amos, June, Nat, Ephraim, Tom, Sigh, Ann, Solomon, and Mark.
also I give and devise to my Daughter Sarah I Grant, black Jane,
Dilly, Paschal, Henry, Matilda, Nelson, little Mariah and Andy
and a horse to be worth one hundred Dollars.

also I give and devise to my son Benjamin Walker old Young,
William, Sally, Clark, L. C. H., old Mary, young Charity,
also I give and devise to my Daughter Mary Perriman Young,
Henry, Hector, Clara, and Peter.

also I give and devise to my daughter Lucertia of Harrison, Pitt
Lucy, Lot, Lucy, old Isaac and a horse to be worth one hundred Dollars
also I give and devise to my son Allen M Walker, George, old Fanny,
Heddy, little Isaac, Lucy, Martin, Alexander, Jacob, Sam, little
Sarah, young Mary, and her Child Beck, Griffin Charles, Sampson
and Clinton.

also I give and devise to my son Allen M Walker in trust for the
use of my daughter Ann M. Womble, Charley, Caesar, Nancy, Sambo,
and her three children Dick, Solomon, and Peter, and a horse to be worth

one hundred Dollars, which said property to be divided to my son Allen H Walker in Trust for the use of my said daughter Anna Mombell, is to be under the immediate control of my son Allen H Walker in trust for the use of my said daughter Anna Mombell for and during her life and after her decease to be equally divided between the lawful heirs of her body, and in case she should die without an heir then and in that case the property so divided to be equally divided between my children that may then be living.

Also I give and devise to my two sons Nathaniel F Walker and Allen H Walker all the residue of my estate of whatever it may consist after paying my just debts, & if there should be a crop or have unfinished my desire is that all the property divided to my wife and children to remain together until the crop is harvested, & do hereby appoint my two sons Nathaniel F Walker and Allen H Walker executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made In witness whereof I James Walker have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine.
