my goods & Chattels, Lovers & Tenements, unto my beloved
Wife Atta Barker during her widowhood for her main-
tenance during the same, and for the Maintenance and
education of those of my Children who are yet under age.
But if she my beloved wife should marry, I will & bequeath
all of said property, or so much as may be remaining to be
equally divided between her & all of my beloved Children.
