Upson County I John S Taylor of this County a State of Georgia  
in view of the uncertainty of life & the certainty of death, do make  
and ordain this my last will & Testament.

chiefly command my soul to the mercy of Him that gave it  
and my body to the earth in decent burial and of my property  
I dispose as follows: First.

Item 1 After the payment of all my just debts, I give to John  
Taylor son of Edward Taylor my negro man named Sam about  
Twenty five years old & my negro woman Martha about twenty six  
years of age; and I also give said John Taylor my house woman  
Susan about forty five years old for the purpose of having her well  
treated during life & especially enjoin it on said John in consideration  
of his legacy herein, that he see to her comfortable provision  
during his life, & make provision for the same after his death

Item 2 I give to William Taylor son of Edward Taylor my negro  
man York about twenty five years old & eight hundred dollars  
in Cash

Item 3 I give all the balance of my property or rights of any & every  
kind real & personal, to the said John Taylor & William Taylor  
to be equally divided between them share & share alike  
I hereby constitute nominate & appoint the said John & William  
Taylor Executors of this my last will & Testament & leave at  
discretionary with them how to raise the money to pay my debts  
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this  
seventeenth day of July eighteen hundred and forty three
