Upson County } In the name of God Amen.
I John Turner of the County and State aforesaid being in bad health but of
sound mind & memory do make & ordain this my last will & testament.—
First. I recommend my spirit to that alwise Creator who gave it—
Second. I wish all my just debts and burial and funeral expenses paid out of
my estate—

Third. I loan unto my wife Mary Turner during her widowhood the use
of the lot of land whereon I now reside No One hundred and forty five in
the truth district of formerly Monroe now Upson County also lot number
One hundred & sixty two in the district & County last mentioned & adjoining
the lot I now live on also eight negroes by Sarah Lewis & Phillis his
wife. Dick. Green. George. Tiller & Millie Also two Choice horses or Mules
five Cows and Calves. ten hogs One year old. two Sows & pigs five ewes
& lambs two feather beds bedsteads & furniture one Beamsaw called here
my wifes six select chairs and as much other house hold furniture
as may be actually necessary for her to have in Order to keep house
likewise One Coffer of Box & Cart an adequate supply of Kitchen fur-
niture & plantation tools and a sufficient support for the first year
after my death — If my said wife Shall Marry it is my will that
One Thousand dollars worth of the property loaned her above be allotted
to her out of Said property to be adjudged by the members of the Inferior
Court if any if more than by five Justices of the peace who are in fair
Standing which said One Thousand dollars worth of property I give
unto my said wife Mary & her heirs forever after taking out the
One Thousand dollars worth of property as before Mentioned I wish
One half of the remainder loaned to my said wife Mary during her
life provided the man to whom she may be married will first give
good & sufficient security to insure the return of the said "One half
of the remainder" with its increase at the death of my said wife Mary
when I wish said "one half of the remainder" and its increase equally divided
amongst my then surviving grand Children the one half of the remainder
after deducting the One Thousand dollars worth of property given to my wife
not loaned to my wife during her life I wish sold as soon as convenient
after her marriage & the money raised by said one half not loaned
to my wife put out at interest and on the twenty fifth day of
December Eighteen hundred & fifty I desire the principal & interest
to be equally divided among my then surviving grand Children—
Fourth — If my said wife Mary should not marry it is my wish that she have
the privilege of disposing by Will of One Thousand dollars worth of the
property loaned to her first aforesaid in any way she may desire
it being about the amount of property I received by her, the
balance of the property

I wish equally divided between my surviving grand children at his death
Fifth - I desire to my grand son Edwin C. Turner son of Matthew and
Eliza ~~Turner~~ Turner one negro boy slave named Albert to him & his heirs
forever -

Sixth. I give in trust to Jonah Roberts & James Barnes of Hancock
County Jacob King & Zachariah H. Gordon of Upson County & wife Maria
of Wilkes County five hundred dollars to be appropriated by them in
any way they may think best for the support & promulgation of the
gospel & should any of the aforesaid trustees depart this life before I
do it is my wish that those surviving appoint trustees in the place
or places of them that may have deceased if there be a majority
surviving if not I wish the Flint river association to appoint
so as to make the number five & those so appointed in either case
shall have as full power to appropriate said money viz five hundred
dollars as those appointed by me could have done had they been
living -

Seventh, I give unto my son Matthew Turner all the negroes now in his
possession placed there by me with their increase to him & to his heirs forever
except the negro Lucy which said negro may be returned to me & in her
place I give my son Matthew as much money as will furnish a likely
young negro woman -

Eighth, I bequeath unto my son Edwin C. Turner two negroes to wit Billy
& his wife Matilda with their future increase to him & to his heirs
forever. Also I give unto my son Edwin during his natural life five
other negroes to wit Little Beck & her child Mariah & her youngest
child Eegine. It is my will that the negroes bequeathed & given in
this item to my son Edwin C. Turner and the negroes I gave to my
son Matthew Turner be valued & if there should be a difference on
the valuation I wish them made equal in the division of the other
property good notes or any other article of value that I may leave -
Ninth - I wish Matthew Turner to keep little Jim a negro I gave to my
grand son John Seay who is dead -

Tenth - I have given Isaac to my son Edwin C. Turner -

Eleventh - I give unto my son Matthew Turner half the balance of my
negroes land stock of all kinds notes accounts or demands of any
kind not heretofore or hereafter particularly devised to him & to his
heirs forever in fee simple -

Twelfth - I lend to my son Edwin C. Turner during his life One thousand
dollars - of which amount Five hundred & fifty dollars has been handed
him - also half of all and every other article of property good chattels
lands tenements debts or demands of any kind whatsoever, should
my son Edwin C. Turner die before his legitimate Child or children

living at his death than 8, in that case all the property I have loaned him aforesaid I give & devise unto him & his heirs forever in fee simple but should my son Edwin C. Turner depart this life without a lawful legitimate Child then & in that case I wish the whole of the property lands negroes debts demands &c &c I have loaned him for & during his life time to be returned to my son Matthew Turner & his heirs & I hereby give & bequeath it to my said son Matthew Turner & his heirs —

Thirteenth, I make my two Sons Matthew Turner & Edwin C. Turner the Executors of this my last will & testament —

alteration in my foregoing will bearing date on the fourteenth day of June 1831.
viz. I revoke that part of my foregoing will loaning to my wife Mary Turner
the use of the Lot of Land wherein I then lived number One hundred and
forty five in the truth District of formerly Monroe now Upson County also
lot number One hundred and Sixty two in the said district and county last
mentioned and adjoining the aforesaid lot number One hundred and
forty five, and loan her instead of the aforesaid land there sum of Fifteen
hundred dollars in cash to be applied by my Executors to the purchase
of other Lands which Lands when purchased as aforesaid I wish to be taken
and considered in lieu of the lands loaned in my foregoing will and
to be possessed and enjoyed by my wife Mary Turner to the same extent
that she could have possessed and enjoyed the aforesaid Lands and to be
subject at the same time to the same restrictions —

I do adopt & retain the foregoing will except so far as has been
altered by this Codicil as my last will and testament —

Upon County, } I John Turner being in sound mind and memory; having previously made
a will in which I appropriated a certain sum of money to procure a home
after my death for my wife Mary Turner, but being dissatisfied with
that item of my will and convinced the amount therein named is not
sufficient to purchase such a situation as I desire I therefore wish
that the sum of three Thousand dollars, be invested in the purchase of
a residence, on the same terms and Conditions specified in my will
in lieu of the sum named in my will. Should she however prefer
the place on which I live, including the purchase made of William
A. Cobb, Doro Smith and Mariah Walker to the proposed offer above
she can have her choice, and it is my Wish that a good and
comfortable framed house be erected on the premises, for her use
and comfort and the expenses of which to be defrayed out
of my estate - November 6th 1838.
