

Upson County 9th July 1836-

In the name of God amen,

I Thomas Lorenzo being Weak

in body but sound in mind and memory, do make and constitute this my last will and testament —, that I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Jane Lorenzo During her Widowhood my plantation and two Negroes namely, Jack and Melly which I wish conducted in such manner as my Executor may think best, for the Interest of my wife and children, also my gray mare and colt, my stock of hogs and cattle plantation tools house hold and Kitchen furniture in the event of the death of my wife or in the event of her intermarriage with any person before my children become of age, in this case, I wish the above property sold Except my two negroes. Which I wish hired until my children may come of age, and then sold, and an equal distribution of all the money which may be raised from my property made between my wife and children, &c.

I. All the remaining ballance of my property I wish sold after my death and all my Just Debts paid, and the balance of the money if any left out in Interest until my children or youngest child shall come of age and then divided as above. And I do further constitute and appoint my beloved wife Jane Lorenzo, and James M. Cooper my Lawfull Executors, all of which I do testify by setting my hand and seal to the same
