a girl about four years old also Martha a girl about five years older
- 4th I give unto Josiah Spivey five dollars
- 5th I give unto Priscilla Stamford my Daughter five dollars
- 6th I give unto Benjamin Ivey my Son five dollars
- 7th I give unto Ephraim Ivey my Son five dollars

And in addition to the foregoing Will & Testament it is my
request that my son Ephraim attend & see that the above
is completed and that he pay all my Funeral expenses when
it is the pleasure of God that I shall depart this life.
