Memory do constitute & ordain this my last
Will & Testament, abrogating all others. After paying all my
just debts I will first to my nephew George M. Bunkley of
Bake County on a loan during his natural life my home plantation
containing the following lots of land viz lots number, sixty six
sixty seven & sixty nine & seventy all in the tenth district of originally
Monroe now Upson County (provided that twenty feet square around
my Husbands grave be kept free from intrusion & only used as a
burial ground for the whole family) in like manner I loan to him
all my negroes (except such as are herein after willed to other
persons) with their natural increase & at his death to be given to
his surviving children:

I will that should said George M. Bunkley die leaving minor
children then John M. Barksdale, John Harvey & John Barksdale
be & are hereby appointed guardians for taking care of said loaned
property & to deliver to them when they become of age or mar-
ry by said Guardians consent if before sixteen years of age, they or any
of them acting jointly or separately at their option.

I will to my neighbor James Anderson a negro man Dave & his
wife Fanny and a negro woman Emily & her children Francesa Richard
& Henrietta & their increase & five hundred dollars.

I will to my sister Ann Harvey two negro women Rachel
and Rena & their increase.

I will to John M. Barksdale & Jefferson Barksdale and
their sister Susannah, Cudgo a negro man & negro woman
Chancy & all her children Fayette, Jesse, Milly, Edigo, Pylva, Jones
& their increase.

I will to George M. Bunkley lot of land number one hundred
and fourteen in the eighth district of originally Monroe (now
Bake County) and one thousand dollars & four of my mules or
mule horses as he may choose & six cows & calves.

I will to my Brother Gerrel Barksdale two thousand dollars.

I will to my Sister Ann Harvey also two thousand dollars and
my baroque & Laine.

I will to my Brother in law only in case he live a twelve month
after my death one thousand dollars.

I will to Horvel Bunkley & Sarah Furlow (The children of Joshua
Bunkley) each one thousand dollars (making two thousand to both)

I will to the children of Horatio Barksdale one thousand dollars to
be equally divided among them.

I will To James Bumley in Trust for his sister Matilda
Joans the West half of Lot Number (48) forty seven & the east half
of Lot Number (50) fifty both in the eighth district originally Monroe
now Pike County which I now own & eight hundred dollars the
use of the said & the interest of the money to be given her each year
for her support & comfort that current year & each an
previous or succeeding year during her natural life

I will to Macharion Owensby, half sister of George W. Bumbley,
five hundred dollars,
and to the said Macharion, two hundred dollars.

I will to Charles & Matiney Two hundred dollars.
I will to my old crippled neighbor Martin Simons for 1st

15 I will that all else of my lands whether in Georgia or Mississippi be offered for sale & be sold before the courthouse door in Thomson in this county & my executor making or causing to be made titles thereto upon the purchase money being paid to him.

I will that all else of my property (except wearing apparel then given to sister Ann without appraisement & two pieces of gold also given to her) be sold on the plantation where and now live or at such other place or places where said property may be at my executors Conveyance.

I will as fund of funeral expences that my executor furnish at
my estate expence to each & all my negroes a suit of clothes (blue
& pocket money, not exceeding thirty dollars nor less than five dollars
the varying sum, to each to be regulated by the discretion of my
executor -

first I will that a neat iron enclosure with stone pillars & rails or other
fastenings be used to encompass the twenty feet square of ground
provided as a burial ground in the first section of this my last
Will & a tomb stone or stones & covering to be placed above my husband
and my grave the kind at the discretion of my executor

and my grave the land at the discretion of my
I will that all the money remaining after discharging performing
the afore mentioned bequests be divided into five equal parts, one
part of said five parts to be equally divided between the three
afore mentioned children of my brother Samuel; one part to be
given to my brother Horatio Barksdale's children; one part to be
given to John Harvey, my sister Ann Harvey son, one part to
be given to John Barksdale my brother Turrels son, and one part
to George W. Bunkley of Pike County.

And third I will That James Anderson be & he is hereby appointed and

constituted executor to this my last will & testament, in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 28th
January, eighteen hundred and fifty.

publish the instrument now presented as her last will and
testament freely voluntarily & of her own accord, and without any
compulsion or influence whatever, that at the time of the Execution of
said will said Testatrix was of sound and disposing mind and memory,
that deponents signed said will as witnesses in the presence of the
Testatrix at her special instance & request & in the presence of each other
sworn to & subscribed before us March 11th 1850.
