In the event of the death or intermarriage of my wife Nancy I desire that all of my property and effects, be thrown into one common lot and distributed equally between my wife Nancy Adair, Elizabeth Smith, Nancy Adams, Prudence Adair, Thomas Adair, William Adair, Martha Adair, Lucy Ann Adair, John Adair & James Adair.

I desire that all notes and accounts that I possess be first applied to the Payment of my just debts and if the notes and accounts are insufficient for the same, my Executors will pay the remainder of my debts, by disposing of such property as will be the least injurious to the Estate. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 17th of January Eighteen hundred and Forty two.

I do hereby appoint Alfred Ferguson of the County of Troup & my wife Nancy as executors and executrix of this my last will & Testament.
