of death and uncertainty of life do make and ordain this
my last will and Testament and hereby revoking all former
wills made by me, first I give and bequeath to Eliza Arnold
& Thomas Butler the North half of Lot of Land P. 242. 600
hundred and forty three to be equally divided and further
an equal division of the residue of my stock and household
furniture after my wife Miller Sellman has got her
part which is left to her by deed of Gift.

And I do further give and bequeath to my son Susan
Sellman One Negro Man named Ben in which where
I William Sellman hath hereunto set his hand and
seal after appointing J. D. Bishop as Executor
in presence of
