This, my last will and Testament, I leave my wife Elizabeth Verden as my Executrix and can to be appointed by the Court,

and I leave to my wife Elizabeth Verden my Land and on which I now live, and known by Sit in Co., in the tenth dist. of Originally Monroe now Upson County, and the half of Sit in Christian, in the Eighth district of Upson County and three negroes by the name of Charles Adam & Kelly, and four Choice Horses or Mares, and six Ten Choice Cows & calves, and all my Stock of Hogs and Ten Head of Choice Sheep, and a sufficient quantity of Corn & Godown, to do her & family until she can make another crop, and such other Provision, as will be sufficient for the support of her family, and all of my House hold and Kitchen Furniture and my Wagon and Car Cart, one half of Choice Store, and Cotton Gin, and two hundred dollars in Cash all of the above named Property and Money I leave to my Wife Elizabeth Verden during her natural life or Widow hood, and at her death or marriage of shall all be equally be divided among all of my Children and all the rest of my Estate, that is not named in this above Question, for my Wife shall be equally among my Wife and Children except Eliza, shall have One Hundred Dollars, and then, and equal Portion among the rest of my Children,

Samuel Verden has, has Fifty Dollars, and Mary Woodall Fifty dollars, and Martha Brown Fifty dollars, which shall be, divided to, out of each of these Parts at the division,
