I, George St. McKilliams of the County and State above written, being of proper mind, memory and description do make and declare, this to be my last will and testament, revoking any and every other made by me.

Item 1st - I will and devise that out of the effects of my estate my wife and I receive a burial suite to our circumstances in life and that some suitable marked stone indicate to our children and grand children the place of our rest, and some neat and permanent enclosure be placed around our graves.

Item 2nd - If at my death I owe any man or woman ought I expressly direct that it be promptly paid.

Item 3rd - All my lands, horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, money, notes, accounts, everything I own, real or personal, rights or credits, I will and bequeath to my wife Nancy and during her natural life and at her death to be equally divided between all my children to wit: J. D. McKilliams, L. D. McKilliams, H. L. McKilliams, J. P. McKilliams, J. L. McKilliams, W. B. McKilliams and my grand-daughter J. M. Neal. If either my daughter or grand-daughter should die childless the remaining legates to have her property, provided the death shall occur before the division of the property.

Item 4th - The property willed in the 3rd item my wife is to enjoy

as she pleases, renting the lands and if needs be selling the personal property at will.

Item 5th: - I further will, that after the death of my wife, that if my children wish to keep the property together they shall have the right to purchase the property or interest of my grand-daughter.

Item 6th: - I hereby appoint my wife Nancy McWilliams executrix and J. S. McWilliams executor of this my last will and testament and request that my executrix and executor so managed and kept and divided the property as to make the legacies all equal and when any surplus shall accumulated it may be divided between my children.

Item 7th: - If by accident or otherwise either I or my wife should be a condition of dependence the legacies of this will taking and nursing we shall be paid for it out of my estate. I George St. McWilliams at my own instance and not in the presence of any person said Nancy McWilliams freed from feeling of fraud or partiality do most solemnly make this my last will and testament.
