Cook their heirs executors, administrators and assigns to and for them and their good absolute use and benefit according to the nature and quality thereof respectively subject only to the payment of my just debts, funeral and testamentary expenses and the charges of proving and registering this my will and I appoint my two mentioned brothers my executors of this my will and hereby revoke all other wills - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year above written. Signed, sealed, published and acknowledged by the said M. M. Cook as and for her last will and testament in the presence of us who in her presence and at her request and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses
