as respects my family and myself that I should
make a disposition of the property with which a
kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore, make
this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking
and annulling all others by me heretofore made

- 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried
in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to
my circumstances and condition in life, my soul
I trust shall return to God who gave it as I
hope for salvation through the merits and atonement
of the last Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
- 2nd I desire and direct that all my just debts be
paid without delay by my executors hereinafter
named and appointed
- 3rd I give and bequeath to my eldest daughter
Sara Maria Long for her own proper use
Three hundred and thirty three dollars and
50/100 cts
- 3rd I give and bequeath to my eldest daughter
Nancy Whitworth wife of Drury Whitworth for
her own proper use the sum of two
hundred and fifty dollars
- 4th I give and bequeath unto Sarah and Mary
McClary wife of John McClary
for their own proper use Two hundred

and fifty dollars

- 6th I give and bequeath to my second son Allen Long for his own proper use the sum of three hundred and thirty three dollars and thirty three cents
- 7th I give and bequeath to my third son Leon Long for his own proper use the sum of three hundred and thirty three dollars and 3 1/2 cts
- 8th I give and bequeath unto my fourth son Moses Long for his own proper use a piece of land wherein he now lives and known as the Ma Hurst land containing twenty acres more or less
- 9th I give and bequeath to my third daughter Elizabeth Alison wife of John Alison for her own proper use the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars
- 10th I give and bequeath to my first daughter Martha Alison wife of Albert Alison for her own proper use the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars
- 11th I give and bequeath to my fifth son David Long a piece of land where he now lives containing eight acres more or less it being the south half of Lot no 182 in the 9th dist & 4th section
- 12th I give and bequeath to my sixth son John H Long a piece of land containing eight acres more or less it being the north half of Lot no 182 in the 9th dist and 4th section
- 13th I give and bequeath to my seventh and eighth sons Adam and Joseph Long at my and my wife's death all the property both real and personal that I and my wife may die seign and possessor of except the sum of twenty five dollars for the use of the body heirs of my daughter Jane Hall if there be any such heirs living
- 14th I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Marsh Phillips Executor of this my last will and Testament this 9th 1869

 part thereof, I therefore do make and publish this
 Codicil to said Will

First I desire and direct that all that portion of Lots
 Number Seventeen and Eighteen in the 11th district
 and 4th section of Walker County which I have
 had from Nancy A. S. Dickey and fully described
 in a deed from Nancy A. S. Dickey to myself
 go to and belong to Sally Long (wife of Adam Long
 deceased) during her life or widowhood to be used &
 controlled by her for the use of and benefit of her
 self and the children of the said Adam Long
 and, and upon her marriage or death then to go
 to and belong to the children of the said Adam
 Long to wit: Nancy Long, Ory Long, John
 Long and Virgin A. Long, each to have an equal
 share in the same

Second After the death of my wife and wife I desire and
 direct that an undivided half part in trust in her
 No Three hundred (303) in the 10th dist and 4th section
 Walker County and all of Lot Three hundred and
 six (306) in the seventh district and 4th section
 to which I have a title and all my personal property
 of every kind including note, accounts household & the like
 furniture and money go to and belong to my two sons
 John A. Long and Moses Long and if the said lots of
 Land should be sold before my death, then in that event
 the proceeds arising from such sale, shall go to and
 belong to my two sons aforesaid upon the same terms
 as the land would, should it not be sold. This bequest
 being made to my two sons for taking care of and
 providing for me and my wife during our lives
