Walker County  The engagement of said mental faculties in presence of  
the undersigned witnesses

First I will and bequeath to my wife Martha Jane Philips all my Estate both  
real and personal to have and to hold (after all demands are paid) for  
her own use and that of her family during her life time unless she  
should marry in that event my effects to be divided equally among my  
children deducting fifty dollars which has been given to my son Mr  
W. Philips and thirty dollars which was given to my daughter Mary  
R. Dickij

2nd I do hereby appoint my wife Martha Jane Philips Executor and my son  
Mark W. Philips Executor to this my Will This March 12<sup>th</sup> 1866

Georgia  I Thomas H. Enters, of said State & County  
Walker County  being of sound and disposing mind & memory,  
do make this my last Will & Testament -

Item First - I give, bequeath & devise to my son in law Andrew, Coa-  
ster, Lot of land no 249, & the south half of Lot no 220, in  
the 27<sup>th</sup> district and third Section of said County

Item Second - I give, bequeath & devise to my Daughter, Jane, Lot of  
land no 188, in the 27<sup>th</sup> dist & 3<sup>rd</sup> Section of Caloosa Coun-  
ty Ga, & Lots no 14775, in 27<sup>th</sup> Dist & 4<sup>th</sup> Section of said  
County of Walker for and during her natural life or  
widowhood, & should she intermarry, then her claims to  
said lands shall cease & at her death or intermarriage,  
the said three Lots of Land mentioned in this Item is to  
be divided as follows. Lot no 188, in Caloosa County  
Ga, is devised & bequeathed to William S. Henry, son of  
said Jane, for & during his natural life with remain-  
der over to his heirs at Law, & Lots nos 14775, is devised  
& bequeathed to Maggie Henry, Daughter of said Jane.
