Will of Joshua Duncan
In the name of God Amen: I Joshua Duncan
of the County of Walker and State of Georgia being of sound
and disposing mind and memory and desirous to settle my
worldly affairs while I have strength so to do - do make this
my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills by me at
any time heretofore made, and first I commit my soul to God
who gave it, and my body I desire to be buried in the burial
ground at Hooknott Church in said County and State.

First I will and bequeath unto my daughter Charity Burrows
five dollars. \$5.00

Second. And to my son James Duncan I have given eighty
acres of land as his part and unto him I will nothing more
third and to be and H. P. Duncan my son I have given eighty acres
of land as his part and to him I will nothing more.

Fourth and to Russell Duncan I have given thirty four

dollars and fifty cents in money, as his part and to him I will nothing more to her and her heirs

Fifth - and to Betsey Smallwood I will twenty acres of land the north side of forty acres of lot No 72 lying in the eighth dist and fourth section of Walker County State of Georgia as her part and to him with nothing more.

Sixth and to Sarah Duncanson my daughter I will the remainder of my estate and possessions to be hers at the death of my wife Sarah Duncanson. said Sarah Duncanson to have and remain in possession of my estate during her life.

Seventh - and it is my will and desire that William L Bailey take and keep this my last will and I now appoint said William L. Bailey executor to the same. and that he have reasonable pay for his time and trouble. Signed in the presence of the undersigned.
