 4th section, thirty acres of the east lot and fifty acres of the west
 lying along, and with S. Roberts' farm north & bounded south by
 U. St. Clark's bounded East with the public road, and west with
 the water divide of the summit of said ridge, with all the
 rights and members and appurtenances to said lands in any
 wise belonging free from all charge and limitation whatever
 to his own proper use and benefit and forever with full power
 to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as he may deem
 proper. I also give and bequeath to my beloved son Robert
 B. in the same unreserved manner the farming, utensils
 used on and belonging to the said farm, and two work mules
 two cows and calves and all the hogs on said farm belonging
 to me, consisting of sowpigs, shoats and pork hogs, and all
 my household and kitchen furniture; all without limitation
 reserved.

Fourthly - I hereby constituted and appoint my friend John
 B. Smith executor of this my last will and testament - this Feb-
 ruary 13th 1882.

a change of land or country that I give unto her a free
and unreserved right to do the same.
