 Walker County I, Thomas Bryan, of said State and County being of advanced age
 but of sound and disposing mind and memory,

knowing that I must shortly depart this life, do now right and proper both as respects myself and family, that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and amending all others by me heretofore made.

First I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my condition and circumstances in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord our Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors herein after named and appointed.

Thirdly - I give bequests and devise to my beloved daughter Josephine and of other name Cary, and one sewing machine free from all charge and limitation whatever, to her own proper use and benefit and behalf forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may deem proper.

Fourthly - I give bequests and devise to my beloved wife Thomasina lots of land Nos. 195 and 196 in the district and section of Walker County, containing three hundred and twenty acres (320) more or less with all the rights members and appurtenances to said lots of land in any belonging free from all charges and limitations whatever, to her own proper use and benefit and behalf for and during her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided between her bodily heirs; I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife my household and kitchen furniture and all my other personal property, to her own proper use and benefit and behalf forever with full power to dispose of the same by will or otherwise as she may see fit.
