 Nasker County $\equiv$ It may concern know by this Indenture
 made & by this presents that this is
 my last Will & Testament, I first declare that I
 am in good health & in my right mind. First
 my just debts to be paid if there be any held
 against me. Then my Land and all my property
 to be my Wife to wit Sarah Wall so during her
 life time should there be any of the above named
 property except the Lands. That she do not
 have any use for she is hereby authorized to
 sell such property & use the proceeds as she
 may see fit. After I cease to wit the said
 Sarah Wall. Then my Son (4) grand children
 to have what is left. My Lands divided (three)
 To Sarah Ann Carruthers my eldest grand daugh-
 ter now the Wife of Rufus Ginnings to have
 after taking of forty acres (4) across the eastward
 Lots Land no 222 in 7th Dist & 4 section. The
 South half of the remainder of the above
 named Lot to be her & her Heirs but to be tra-
 ded until her children come of age but to
 remain as a home for the same. The next eldest
 grand daughter to wit Mary Matilda now
 the Wife of William Ginnings to have my house
 place of Lot of Land no 220 7th dist & 4th section
 making the same which it now stands the line
 down on the South side to include 10 acres of

Woodland on the north east corner. The line
 to start at the east end of the lane + run west
 to the original line. Then she is also to have
 20 acres off of Lot of Land No 222 in 3^d dist
 + 4th Section on the south east corner to be her
 childrens not to be traded until her children
 come of age but to be a town for them until
 they come of age. My next oldest grand daughter
 to wit Mary Elizabeth Wall is to have the
 remaining half of my home place of part
 of Lot of Land No 220. 3^d dist + 4th Section. The
 above named lane to be the north line
 + dividing line between her + her 9 children
 down to the 10 acres of Woodland included
 in Mary's half her Land to wit Mary
 Elizabeth to include the house her mother +
 her two lives in + to include all the remain-
 ing part Lands south of dividing line
 Also 20 acres of Lot Land No 222 in 3^d dist
 + 4th Section on north east corner. To be her
 + her childrens if there be any until her
 children come of age not to be traded
 until then + not then without her consent
 My next oldest grand daughter to wit
 Eliza Anna Wall (wid. of Emm)
 Boyle to have six (6) acres more or less
 off of Lot of Land No 222 in 3^d dist + 4th dist
 off of the north half to be divided east &
 west to be divided between her + her eldest
 sister. After the 40 acres above named is
 taken off of the east end of the lot that
 is equal division of the entire lot after
 40 acres taken off between her + her sister
 and line to run east + west her to have
 north portion + Ann to have south portion
 & be her + her childrens not to be traded
 until her children come of age + not then
 without her consent should she be alive
 at the death of my wife Sarah (Wall) the
 four above named grand daughters to come
 + divide the beds + bedding made an equal
 division of the household + kitchen furniture
 the rest of the property to be sold and
 equally divided between the four above grand
 daughters. This I declare to be my last will
 + testament when into I set my hand + affix
 my seal in the presence of three witnesses
