my Son Thomas Seales as his portion Five dollars. Also I do give
my beloved Daughter Rachel West as her Portion Five
Dollars. Also I do give to my beloved Daughter
Fanny Gaumpton as her Portion Five Dollars. Also
I do give and bequeath to James Madison Seales and
Mary Seales the Son and Daughter Zedekiah Seales all
The balance of my Estate (To wit) two feather Beds
and Household and Kitchen Furniture with a Note
of Two Hundred Dollars in the S. W. Seale
Which Money I wish to be put out on interest untill
they become of age. Also I do leave Zedekiah Seales
as my Executor to this will, and do Behest all other
Wills up to this date Acknowledged and signed in
presence of us witnesses in the twelfth line with the
word Three Dollars and in the 25th line with the word
Seales.
