Testament First, my will and desire is that
after my Just Debts are paid, that my
belov'd wife Lucy, Shall have the Disposal
of the whole of my property to my Children
During her widowhood Secondly, that my
Children be Educated and Maintained, as my
wife Shall think best, and that as my daughter
that is already married Has had from me
to the amount of one Hundred & fifty Dollars
my wish is that the rest of my Children
as they become of age or marry that they
Shall have to the same amount, and should
there be an overplus of Property I shall
be equally divided amongst my Children
in addition to the portions already allotted
them and further more if my wife
Should ever think Proper to marry she
shall take one third of my property and
the balance shall be equally divided -
amongst my Children and I have also
thought proper to appoint my beloved wife
and my friend Edmund Greenham Executors to
this my will 20th March 1823
