therefore make this my last Will and Tes-
tament hereby revoking and annulling
all others by me heretofore made.

First

I desire and direct that my body be buried
in a decent and Christianlike manner
suitable to my circumstances and condi-
tion in life my soul I trust shall be
returned to rest with God who gave it
as I hope for salvation through the
merits and atonement of the blessed Lord
and Saviour Jesus Christ

Second

I desire that a debt of Twenty Dollars
that I owe to Charlotte Wargraves at this
time be paid without delay by my Executor
hereinafter named and appointed.

Thirdly

As my beloved children Grey Ann Elizabeth
Mary Martha, Henry B. John Wargraves,
Nancy Caroline, Thomas G., William Jordan,
Precilla Emily, Susan Allen and Sarah
Mariah are all grown or so nearly so as
to be able to work for their support without
the benefits of any donation from me
while my infant son Dayly Wilson is
totally unable to so do I give bequeath
to him the aforesaid Dayly Wilson all of
my property of every description consist-
ing of lot of land No. 144 Ware County Wills
and forty one in the fifth district of
1866-1869

originally Applying now Ware County
 containing four hundred and ninety
 acres more or less with all the
 rights members and appurtenances
 to said lot of land in any manner
 I also bequeath and devise to my son
 Dayley Wilson Three and three quarters
 acres of land from ~~the East~~ ^{the} side
 of lot No. four hundred and eighty
 in the District and County aforesaid
 also fifty head of stock Cattle more or
 less, sixteen head of sheep more or
 less, Twenty head of Hogs more or
 less, one Horse and 1 Colt also my
 farming utensils of every description
 also a set of Carpenter tools and one
 set of Blacksmith tools forever.

Fourthly

I desire that my beloved wife
 Mary Martha should have a support
 out of my property in accordance
 with the style that we have lived
 during the term of her natural
 life, and I especially direct and
 request that my Executor hereinafter
 named and appointed should
 carry out this the fourth item
 of my last will and Testament.

Fifthly

I hereby appoint my son Henry
 B. Wilson Guardian over the property
 and person of the aforesaid Minor
 son Dayley Wilson and in case of the
 death of the said Henry B. then my next
 son John H. Wilson to be guardian over
 the property and person of the said Minor
 son Dayley Wilson and in case of his death
 then my third son Thomas ^{Ware County, Georgia}
 Guardian of the property and person of
 the said Minor child Dayley Wilson.
